Summary Corrective Action Plan No. 2012-045 On Saturday, October 2, 2010, at approximately 11:10 p.m., Los Angeles County deputy sheriffs arrested the plaintiff for a violation of California Health and Safety Code section 11350, Possession of Designated Controlled Substances. During the subsequent investigation, it was determined the items in the plaintiff's possession were commercially available. The plaintiff was released from custody pursuant to California Penal Code section 849(b)(1).

In her lawsuit, the plaintiff alleges she was subjected to federal civil rights violations by representatives of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department had relevant policies and procedures/protocols in effect at the time of this incident.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's training curriculum addresses the circumstances which occurred in this incident.

The facts in this case were reviewed by representatives of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's Lomita Station. No systemic issues were identified and no employee misconduct is suspected. Consequently, no personnel-related administrative action was taken.

Although the incident was deemed to have been handled within Departmental policy, several employees were appropriately counseled. At the direction of the unit commander, the shift watch commanders also conducted a series of extensive training sessions with all patrol personnel on (among other topics) field investigations, laws of arrest, search and seizure, use of force and reporting procedures, tactical communications, drug/narcotic recognition, identification of impaired drivers, booking procedures, and report writing.

Summary Corrective Action Plan No. 2012-037 On Sunday, October 18, 2009, at approximately 2:45 p.m., a Los Angeles County deputy sheriff was escorting a handcuffed inmate (plaintiff) when the plaintiff became angry and assaulted the deputy. The deputy struck the plaintiff in the stomach with his fists and forced
	him to the ground. Once on the ground, the plaintiff disregarded verbal commands and continued to struggle with the deputy. The deputy deployed Oleoresin Capsicum spray, but the plaintiff continued to struggle. A second deputy responded to assist and also became involved in the struggle to restrain the plaintiff. The plaintiff eventually complied with the deputies' instructions and stopped struggling.

1. Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

In his lawsuit, the plaintiff alleged he was subjected to excessive force by members of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department had relevant policies and procedures/protocols in effect at the time of this incident.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's training curriculum addresses the circumstances which occurred in this incident.

The facts in this case were presented to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's Executive Force Review Committee. The committee concluded that the level of physical force used by the deputy sheriffs was reasonable, necessary, and in compliance with Department policy. Consequently, no corrective action measures are recommended or contemplated.
