Date of incident/event:	November 7, 2011.
Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	On November 7, 2011, Ms. Leilani Fukui and her twin sister, Ms. Luana Fukui were walking eastbound in a marked crosswalk across Lark Ellen Avenue at Tudor Street, when they were struck by a southbound 2007 Honda Civic driven by Ms. Kimberly Metz, causing serious injuries to Ms. Luana Fukui and fatally injuring Ms. Leilani Fukui.

1. Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

The subject collision was caused by Ms. Metz who was unable to clearly see out of her windshield as her windshield was foggy. The motorist failed to observe the flashing beacons and did not observe the pedestrians who were walking within the marked yellow crosswalk at the subject intersection. The motorist was found to be in violation of Section 21950 of the California Vehicle Code, which states "The driver of a vehicle shall yield the right of way to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within any marked crosswalk or within any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection."

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:
(Include each corrective action, due date, responsible party, and any disciplinary actions if appropriate)

Previous traffic studies were conducted at the subject intersection to determine the need for traffic signal control. Based on these studies, this location did not meet the criteria necessary to establish traffic signal control. On November 22, 2011, subsequent to the subject incident, the Board of Supervisors made a motion directing the Department of Public Works to install traffic signals at the subject intersection. The traffic signals were installed on July 19, 2012.

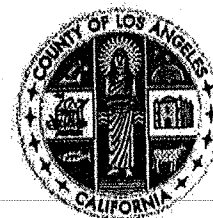

County of Los Angeles, et al.</u> Summary Corrective Action Plan No. 2013-042</p> <p>Between February 13, 2009, and February 21, 2009, the plaintiff was incarcerated in the Los Angeles County Twin Towers Correctional Facility. The plaintiff alleged that on or about February 16, 2009, he was the subject of unreasonable physical force applied by members of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.</p>

1. Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

In his lawsuit, the plaintiff alleged he was subjected to unreasonable physical force applied by members of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:
(Include each corrective action, due date, responsible party, and any disciplinary actions if appropriate)

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department had relevant policies and procedures/protocols in effect at the time of the incident.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's training curriculum addresses the circumstances which occurred in the incident.

This incident was thoroughly investigated by representatives from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's Twin Towers Correctional Facility. Their investigation revealed no evidence of physical force being used on the plaintiff. In addition, their investigation concluded that at no time during the course of the plaintiff's incarceration did he file a complaint/grievance alleging physical force, negligence, injury, or distress of any kind.







County of Los Angeles, et al.</u> Summary Corrective Action Plan No. 2013-035</p> <p>On Monday, December 7, 2009, at approximately 5:37 a.m., a Los Angeles County deputy sheriff was driving a black and white County of Los Angeles-owned transportation bus north on Mona Boulevard when the vehicle he was driving collided with another vehicle in the intersection of Imperial Highway, Lynwood.</p> <p>The plaintiff (a passenger on the bus) alleged she was injured as a result of the traffic collision.</p>

1. Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

The root cause in this incident is a member of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department violating California Vehicle Code section 22107, Turning Movements and Required Signals.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:
(Include each corrective action, due date, responsible party, and any disciplinary actions if appropriate)

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department had relevant policies and procedures/protocols in effect at the time of the incident.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's training curriculum addresses the circumstances which occurred in the incident.

This traffic collision was thoroughly investigated by representatives from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the California Highway Patrol. Their investigations concluded the deputy sheriff caused the traffic collision by violating California Vehicle Code section 22107, Turning Movements and Required Signals.


The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's administrative review revealed employee misconduct. Appropriate administrative action was imposed.





Date of incident/event:	Monday, December 21, 2009 at 10:34 a.m.
Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	<p>On Monday, December 7, 2009, a Los Angeles County-owned transportation bus collided with another vehicle in the intersection of Imperial Highway, Lynwood. The Plaintiff, who was a passenger on the bus, alleged she was injured as a result of the traffic collision.</p> <p>On December 21, 2009, the Plaintiff, who has a history of Non-Insulin Dependent Diabetes Mellitus (NIDDM), complained to the nurse of right eye blindness for 2 weeks. The nurse referred the Plaintiff for a routine eye examination for right eye blindness.</p> <p>On February 12, 2010, the Plaintiff was evaluated by the LASD Ophthalmologist and was referred to LAC+USC for further evaluation. LAC+USC diagnosed her with "vitreous hemorrhage." The LAC+SUC notes indicated "No acute interventions needed at this time." They recommended "Retinal Detachment" precautions and elevate head of bed with 2-3 pillows at night.</p>

1. Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

The nurse failed to appreciate the significance of a new onset sudden loss of vision in the Plaintiff's right eye, resulting in untimely physician referral. The nurse referred the Plaintiff for a routine eye examination and did not indicate in her documentation/referral that this was a "new onset sudden" loss of vision.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:
(Include each corrective action, due date, responsible party, and any disciplinary actions if appropriate)

The nurse will attend a continuing education class specific to eye assessment and submit proof of attendance.

Medical Services Bureau (MSB) will create a Bureau wide policy which will establish guidelines for physician notification when there are sudden and/or marked changes in signs, symptoms, or behavior of the patient. Briefing of the new policy will be provided for all MSB nursing staff.


A re-briefing of MSB Policy #219, Physician/RNP Lines-Consult Referrals will be provided to all MSB nursing staff as soon as possible.





